

Fun & Easy Thanksgiving Crafts

Hands n' Plate Turkey

Nothing says Thanksgiving like this fun and easy little turkey craft! Kids will enjoy tracing their hands, and parents will enjoy saving them as keepsakes. They're a great way to decorate your classroom. Or, greet each guest at your Thanksgiving table by adding their name to the front of the turkey and using as a place card.

Materials Needed

Black Paper Dessert Plate, 7" (SKU# 922889)

Construction Paper (SKU# 819350)

Scissors (SKU# 831982)

Colored Pencils (SKU# 972657)

White Glue (SKU# 983763)

Clear Tape (SKU# 659250)



Note: For younger children, adults may want to pre-cut the turkey body shape, eyes, beak, feet, and waddle.

Instructions

1. Invert (turn out) the edge of the black paper plate so the turkey will have a fat body.
2. Cut a 5" peanut-shaped turkey head/neck from construction paper and glue to the front of the plate.
3. Kids can either use colored pencils to draw the turkey eyes, beak, and waddle, or the shapes can be cut out of construction paper and glued to the turkey face (as shown above).
4. Have kids trace their hands on various colors of construction paper (we used yellow, red, and cream, but any colors will do) and cut them out. Fan them and tape to the back side of the paper plate to make the turkey's tail feathers.
5. Cut out two turkey legs with feet and tape the tops to the back side of the plate.
